1 Corinthians 13:8-13 (NKJV)

8 Love never fails. But whether there are prophecies, they will fail; whether there are tongues, they will cease; whether there is knowledge, it will vanish away. 9 For we know in part and we prophesy in part. 10 But when that which is perfect has come, then that which is in part will be done away.

11 When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child; but when I became a man, I put away childish things. 12 For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part, but then I shall know just as I also am known.

13 And now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these is love.

Better Love Endures

The traditional vows in a marriage are “to have and to hold from this day forward, for better or for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, from this day forward until death do us part”. These vows are sealed by the giving and receiving of rings. The history of wedding rings goes back to ancient Egypt. The Egyptians would use papyrus from the river Nile to twist and braid into rings and bracelets. The ring was a symbol of eternity. The hole in the center of the ring was a symbol of the door leading to events both known and unknown. The rings that were given then and today have no special powers. They don't eliminate all threats to a relationship. The high divorce rate reminds us of how ending love is. A ring doesn't mean love will endure. It's only a symbol.

The Better Love that the apostle Paul speaks of is enduring. The love that we are to have with one another is best described by the love God has for us. We have committed a number of unfaithful acts, but the cross is there to remind us of God's enduring love. The gift of forgiveness on God's part is a reminder of this unending love He has for us. This doesn't mean we take advantage of it because Better Love refuses to do that.

What if we demonstrated this same love in our marriages, friendships, and church family? What if the love we have for one another was enduring? It needs to be because we are imperfect and fallible. The greatest demonstration we can have is not a ring or certificate. It's our faithfulness to God and His glorious church. It's giving grace to those who mess up. It's forgiving when something has gone wrong. It's enduring till the end.

T – Transformed

The final word in the **IMPACT** Statement is **Transformed**.

We continuously work to improve our congregation, and we never stop learning or studying in order to teach others.

The corresponding verse is:

And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God.

-- Romans 12:2 (NKJV)

In this verse, Paul makes an interesting contrast. He starts by telling us not to be Conformed to the world. Conforming suggests the idea of allowing something (some force) to shape us. Years ago, when I taught a 3rd – 4th Grade class, I would demonstrate this by having the children squeeze a handful of Play-Doh. Then, we would look at the way the Play-Doh conformed to the shape of their hands. This gives us the idea of what the world will do to us, if we allow it.

There are pressures at every turn trying to shape us.

Normally, we would contrast the concept of Conforming with being rigid or firm. But, in Romans, Paul takes his contrast in a different direction. He contrasts Conforming to the world with being **Transformed**. **Transformation** implies that we don't just stay the same. We become something better, improved, enhanced. Paul calls for us to take what we are and make a change in a positive direction. In my 3rd – 6th Grade class, I demonstrated this by taking various ingredients, mixing them together, and baking cookies. All the ingredients were **Transformed** into something better.

So, how do you **Transform** yourself? Paul gives us the answer. You must “*renew our mind*”. We must put ourselves in a mindset that is higher, more spiritual, and in line with God. Take another look at the words from the **IMPACT** Statement. *We never stop learning or studying in order to teach others*. It is through God's Word that we renew our minds and **Transform** ourselves.

Challenge yourself this year to put more time into God's Word. Study it. Meditate on it. Apply it to your life. Keep it in your mind and write it on your heart (*Hebrews 8:10*). You might be surprised at the **Transformation** that occurs.
