Luke 22:14-22 (NKJV)

14 When the hour had come, He sat down, and the twelve apostles with Him. 15 Then He said to them, "With fervent desire I have desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer; 16 for I say to you, I will no longer eat of it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God." 17 Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and said, "Take this and divide it among yourselves; 18 for I say to you, I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes." 19 And He took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me." 20 Likewise He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you. 21 But behold, the hand of My betrayer is with Me on the table. 22 And truly the Son of Man goes as it has been determined, but woe to that man by whom He is betrayed!"

Remember

"If we have no memory, we are adrift because memory anchors us to the past, present, and future."

Do you remember when you went to a restaurant and ate inside? Do you remember going to school and seeing your friends? Do you remember not having to stand six feet away from people? Do you remember seeing each other for church services and the joy of being together? We obviously remember those things and miss them due to the situation of our day.

Do you remember beyond that? Do you remember why you became a Christian? Do you remember the verse or story that pricked your heart? Do you remember going and doing in the name of the Lord for someone else? We are being forced as a Christian to be still. I believe we can use this time to our advantage by remembering what is good.

The Bible points to the practice of remembering. The Hebrews were commanded to *"Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it Holy"* (Exodus 20:8). When Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper, He said, *"Do this in remembrance of Me"* (Luke 22:19). The writer in Hebrews warns us to *"give the more earnest heed to things we heard, lest we drift away"* (Hebrews 2:1). We do this by remembering. However, more than that, we listen, speak, and do things that help us to remember. We do a good enough job of remembering the bad, negative, and sinful. What about remembering what will help us in our faith?

We remember what Jesus did, as it anchors us today as we wait till all things are come to pass one day. What can I do? I'm bored with all this time on my hands. Remember God. Remember His Word. Remember the greatest story ever told. Remember what He has already promised us. Remember, lest we drift away.

Questions Submitted

The following questions were submitted this week. Josh will address these on the live-stream after our Sunday services.

- 1) In the Bible, it talks about where two [or] more are gathered in His name. If I'm home alone (watching via FB live) worshipping, am I in accordance with God's will? Is my worshipping Him alone truly okay with Him?
- 2) Why do we reserve communion for adults/those that have been baptized? Is this a scriptural command or a tradition of the church of Christ?
- 3) Is it okay to leave [my] contribution at [the] church office on a day other than Sunday, or do I have to put [it] in the plate during worship? Is it okay to use online giving options, especially if it comes out of my bank on a day besides Sunday?

Sunday School Substitute **The Parable of The Lost Coin** Luke 15:8-10

Since Sunday School is temporarily suspended, use this information for your own Sunday School at home. There are ideas for all age groups. Work on it alone or as a family.

Everyone:

- Read the scripture text of the parable.
- Remember that a coin in Bible times was much more valuable than ours are today. This lost coin was probably worth at least an entire day's wages, maybe more.

Adults:

- **Consider the circumstances.**
 - The Parable of the Lost Coin immediately follows the Parable of the Lost Sheep, which we looked at last week.
 - Re-read Luke 15:1-7 and consider the situation that prompted these parables.
- **Consider these questions about the parable.**
 - What 3 steps did the woman take to find the coin? What does that say about her desire to find it?
 - How long did the woman search for the coin?
 - What do you think might be represented by the lamp that the woman lit? (Psalm 119:105, Matthew 5:14-16)
 - Why was a celebration appropriate when the 1 coin was found but not for the 9 that were not lost?
 - What are differences between a lost sheep and a lost coin?
 - What are differences in how they may have gotten lost?
 - What are differences in respect to them knowing that they were lost?
- **Other Questions**
 - Have you ever torn up your whole house to find something important that you had lost?
 - Is each and every person important to God? (2 Peter 3:9)
 - How valuable is someone's soul? (Luke 15:10)
 - Is your manner and attitude important while seeking the lost? (2 Timothy 2:23-26)
 - How much effort are we willing to go to in order to find the lost?

Youth Group:

- **Consider these questions after reading the parable.**
 - Why do you think 1 coin was so important to this woman?
 - How much money would you have to lose for you to search your entire house in order to find it?
 - How diligently would you search if you lost your mobile phone? What about your car keys?
 - What would you hate to lose worse than anything? How does this compare to a person's soul lost forever?
- **Activities for Youth Group Members**
 - Look for a special Youth challenge from Kory involving coins. How many coins can you catch without losing any?
 - See how many coins you can stand on their sides. Post it on Instagram using #HeightsChallenge.
 - Call a friend who might be in need and tell them that you are praying for them.
