Anatomy of an Encourager

What is something you can do every day no matter what? You are able to do it regardless of what phase we are in or recommendations from the CDC. You can do it without getting in a car and driving somewhere. You can demonstrate it with little effort on your part. However, the benefit(s) are limitless if we get into the daily practice of it. What am I talking about?

Encouragement.

The origin of the word “encourage” comes from an Old French word *encoragier* meaning “to make strong, hearten”. The greatest command says, “*You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength*” (Mark 12:30). I want you to notice the phrase “*with all your strength*”. Encouragement makes or puts courage in our hearts. It gives us strength.

We have several things you can do this month that will encourage members, shut-ins, and our local police. We can be light & salt and plant a seed by writing an encouraging letter to the West Precinct police station. What if we had twenty people to send them twenty encouraging cards? How would that make them feel? What does an unexpected note of encouragement do to you? It makes you feel appreciated and loved. I personally believe we can be a more attractive church through encouragement. It’s a different message than what we hear daily in the news and on social media accounts. The Bible says, “*Encourage one another daily while it is called ‘Today’, lest any of you be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin*” (Hebrews 3:13). What can you do today? Encourage someone. We can help someone to love God with all their strength by making them strong through encouragement.


Attention Men of the Congregation




The Fiery Furnace (Daniel 3)
