Finding What We Need Under the Sun - Finding Hope

The book of Ecclesiastes can at times appear to be dark and depressing. It must be kept in the context of the writer. The Teacher is considering life “under the sun” and seeing if there is anything worthwhile, satisfying, and meaningful. The Teacher had mentioned “God” in chapters 1, 2, and 3. However, he doesn’t mention “God” in chapter 4. His focus is strictly on the things “under the sun”. It is a reflection of a life without God.

What is more hopeless than a life without God? Imagine, if you will, all the problems we are facing as a country and the problems we face personally. What if you didn’t have the knowledge and relationship you have with God? What if there was no understanding of His word or the awesome gift of Jesus Christ? How depressing would it be for you if all you had were the things in this physical life only.

The Teacher examined a situation like that, and his conclusion is strong but true. “Therefore I praised the dead who were already dead, more than the living who are still alive” (4:2). Doesn’t that describe a “hopeless situation”? I agree with the Teacher that there are many things worse than death. One of the greatest is a life without God. This is a hopeless state and feeling. It is troubling to know there are many in this life without God. They have no knowledge of the Truth and how it can set them free of this hopeless state. My friends there is hope in this life. It’s not in the president, cure of the pandemic, or your problems being fixed. It’s in the life and work of Jesus Christ.

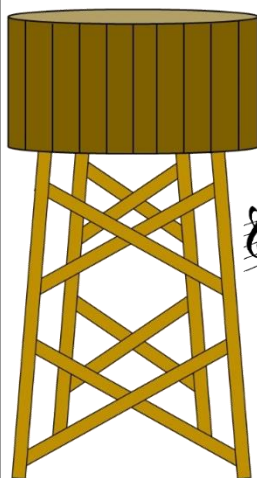
